Gather all documents needed to prepare an accurate return, including W-2s, 1099 forms, statements of interest and dividends, and relevant receipts. Failure to provide certain information may mean an incomplete return, which may require additional processing and delay any refund due.

Check names, Social Security numbers, and amounts for accuracy and correct spelling. Also, if you supply a bank account number, double-check it.

Penalties Could Apply

What if you file late or can't pay your tax bill? Separate penalties apply for failing to pay and failing to file. Both are based on a percentage of unpaid or late taxes. You can avoid the late filing penalty by obtaining an extension of the time to file until October 15. However, note that this is only an extension to file. You must still estimate and pay taxes due by the deadline or face possible penalties.

These penalties can be severe, but if the lateness occurs for a "reasonable cause," such as illness, the IRS may excuse it. Contact us with your questions.
